Digital Verification Tool (DVT) Update	Phase 1 of DVT deployed in December 2009. Phase 1 introduced the DVT, retired QA/QC Pro, and integrated the DVT into the MIP. Phase II will focus on allowing users to submit Personal Geodatabase DFIRMs as well as Shapefiles. The deployment date for Phase 2 is to be determined.
Why was this tool (DVT) implemented without notice? Users were unsure of the timeline.	Notifications went out in early December 2009. There were communication gaps for this release.
What is the best way to notify mapping partners of upcoming MIP and other system changes?	The consensus was that communicating to the Regional Champions and Black Belts is the best way to disseminate information to mapping partners, Cooperating Technical Partners (CTPs) and Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contractors.

Why is the decommission date exact instead of a fade away?	A hard date was needed so new projects were not created in the existing DFIRM tools.
	This date was chosen to correspond with the migration of the MIP to a new hosting facility, which is in alignment with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) information technology (IT) vision. The existing DFIRM Tools servers and software will not be migrated to the new facility.
Is there an updated list of closed jobs in existing DFIRM tools? Could the list be updated monthly?	The list shows turned off jobs as of the November 20, 2009 cutoff date. CDS is working with FEMA and the other Risk MAP contractors to determine the feasibility of updating the list monthly.
Are there any upcoming changes to the MIP workflow?	There are currently no planned service packs due to the hosting and data center migration effort. After the migration is complete, new enhancements to the Mapping Information Platform (MIP) will be evaluated by FEMA.
